Please make sure that if you have a child starting school in September 2023 that any reception applications have been completed online by SUNDAY 15TH JANUARY.

Attendance in School

We are experiencing an increased number of requests for holidays during term time. Please note that unfortunately most of these will be classed as unauthorised unless there are exceptional circumstances surrounding the absence. In this instance, we have a duty to report the absence to the local authority who may choose to issue a fixed penalty notice.

We understand that there will be times when absence is unavoidable and acceptable. Each absence is classed as authorised or unauthorised. Absences are coded as authorised where reasons are considered valid and unauthorised where no explanation or unacceptable reasons are given.

The following reasons are for example not acceptable:

- shopping visits
- care for family members
- days out
- holidays taken in term time (including long weekends taken on Fridays and / or Mondays)
- parental illness
- sleeping in / missing school transport
- birthdays or birthday treats

Every term I carry out a check of attendance across the school and should your child's absence fall below the expected 95% you may receive a letter outlining the expectations we have around attendance. Should this continue to show no improvement you will then be invited to an attendance meeting in school. We do appreciate that children get poorly and need to take time off school. However, I am sure you all support that term time absence has an undoubted negative impact on a child's learning and through the remaining part of the school year we would ask that any absences are kept to a minimum.

What the law says about school attendance:

The law requires all children between the ages of 5 and 16 to be in full time education. Under Section 7 of the Education Act 1996 it is the duty of the parent/carer of a child of compulsory school age to ensure that they attend school regularly.

Supervision Order Children's Act 1989: The local authority can apply to the courts where attendance remains poor. A named education supervisor would be appointed to work with the family for up to 12 months to ensure the young person receives full time education.

School Attendance Order Education Act 1996: If this is issued; parents would be directed to register their child at a school named by the local authority. A warning letter can be issued when a pupil has had 10 or more unauthorised absences from school. The warning letter gives parents a period of 15 days of monitoring. If at the end of this period if there has not been an improvement or an improvement has been made but not sustained, a Penalty Notice will be issued.

Families who take their children out of school for holiday within term time, or for other unauthorised absences exceeding 10 sessions (5 days). A Penalty Notice will be issued.

Penalty Notice: Each parent/carer would have to pay £60.00 per child. If this is not paid within 21 days, the payment increases to £120.00 per child per parent. Payments will not be accepted after 28 days. If parents do not pay, the Local Authority will prosecute in the Magistrates' Court. If convicted the parent will have a criminal record and may receive a fine of up to £1000.

The department for Education have a range of information available regarding attendance.

Prime Energy Drinks

From time to time different crazes come along - loom bands, trading cards, poppets etc the latest being Prime Energy drinks. I am sure many of you will have seen them in the news and the high demand by young people which has followed.

We are now seeing a number of children bringing these bottles in, some full of the original energy drink but others just used as water bottles. Unfortunately, they have today caused some issues and small disagreements within school resulting in staff time being used to resolve disputes over bottle ownership.

Please can I ask that children do not bring Prime energy drink bottles into school as a drink or as a water bottle. I am sure that you will agree with me in that staff teaching time can be spent more effectively working with the children.

This year they will be continuing to fundraise to help support the development of our outdoor quiet area. This has been a great addition to our playtime space and is already used by a number of children to sit, read, talk, play board games or make models with our lego.



This term we will be looking to add more to this area with astro turf mats, outdoor storage for the lego and games as well as picnic benches with table top games. As well as developing a raised pond and wildlife area for our science and environmental work.
