
On Tuesday we worked with the children on another inspiring day looking at the UN Rights of a Child.

Through the

day we revisited the work from February 1st on the UN Sustainable Goals with a focus for KS2 on Refugees and KS1 on Saving our Seas. The children produced some fantastic and thought provoking art and written work through the day.



Year 2 also enjoyed an art workshop creating Tudor Roses which was led by Mrs Waddington one of our Local governing committee members. A huge thank you to her for donating her time and talents to support the children with their artwork.



On Thursday we thoroughly enjoyed the delights of World Book Day. Mrs McShane did an amazing job putting together a programme of activities throughout the day to promote the love of reading.

Children across the school were invited to dress as characters from their favourite books if they wished to and they completed work in the classrooms based on the text - " I don't like books. Never. Ever. The End". Throughout the day the children took part in Stop, Drop & Read sessions. The school bell was rung at various intervals throughout the day and the children had to stop, grab a book and take it anywhere in school to read. Nowhere was out of bounds and my office proved to be particularly popular!

















During the afternoon Reception & KS1 were joined by our very

talented author parent Mrs Morrisroe who led an assembly around her latest children's book 'How to Grow a Dragon'. We had treated to an early preview as the book isn't actually published until April!

At the end of the day, we hosted a 'book swap' on the school playground. Any books that were no longer wanted (for children or adults) were displayed on the playground for children and adults to browse and take away (for free) at the end of the school day.



We were also joined earlier in the week by one of our past pupils Mia who is now in Year 7 at Tarporley. Mia is an avid writer and has continued her great work since moving to secondary. It was fantastic for the children to hear her read the poem she has had published as part of our World Book Day celebrations. Well done Mia we are all extremely proud of you.

Today we explored the non-religious world view of Humanism. During the day each class participated in a range of activities which helped them to develop an understanding of the five themes; The Human Being, Understanding the World, One Life, Humanist Ethics and Society Goals and Actions. We hope the children have had an enjoyable day learning more about Humanism as part of our Religious Education curriculum and developing a further understanding and respect for different world views.



As you will be aware we have developed a link with Cape Verde recently. I was delighted to hear that during their holiday to Cape Verde over the half term break Sienna and Harriet visited a primary school to enhance their knowledge and understanding through first hand experience. The girls were able to see a class studying History and were amazed at the hours the children were in school. Thank you Sienna and Harriet for sharing your photos but also taking time during your holiday to visit a school.


