# Online Safety Parent meeting 9am Thursday 4th May

I am aware that a number of our children have their own mobile phone and devices and I am conscious that nowadays most children have these at an earlier age than previously. However with the owning of such devices comes the responsibility of using it appropriately and with respect to others.

It is clearly not school's decision as to when a child is given a mobile phone nor our responsibility as to what APPs the children are using. I do draw your attention however to the APPS and their Age ratings graphic below.

Unfortunately, we do often see issues from irresponsible use of mobile phones coming back into school along with a lack of understanding and appreciation as to how to use a mobile phone responsibly. This lack of understanding can leave our children extremely vulnerable to their peers and online predators. Difficulties can take the form of comments made on social media after school hours, inappropriate messaging, photos and sexting and can lead to much more distressing scenarios developing.



To support parents and help them navigate their way through this new online world our children are part of I have organised a parent session with PC Andrew Cornall on **Thursday 4th May** in the school hall. Timings are to be confirmed but it is likely that the session will start at 9am so that parents can come into school straight after dropping children off.

A further letter will be sent out after the Easter holidays asking parents to confirm their attendance should they wish to at this event.

### Take away homework reminder

Next week yellow homework books need to be returned to school so that teachers can sign these over the Easter holidays. These will then be returned the first week back of the new summer term. Takeaway homework also needs to be brought into school next week on with **Takeaway homework celebration day on: Wednesday 29th March.** We look forward to seeing the projects and pieces of work the children have created.

### **Parking**

Parking continues to be a concern at the end of the day in particular. This is always exacerbated by any wet, cold and windy weather when more people arrive to collect by car. Please can I ask that we continue to be mindful or safe and considerate parking when dropping off and collecting children. I am mindful that this is not a problem just specific to our school and am always looking at solutions and ideas to help ease the situation. I am planning to start a working party so that school and parents can we collaboratively to find solutions to parking at these busy times. We have had a number of people parking recently in our dedicated school bus parking space. Please can this be used by the bus only so that we can ensure the children can be dropped off and safely collected from school. I am also mindful that some children are collected by Grandparents so ask that this message is shared with all who collect children from school.

### **School Attendance**

As a trust we set out attendance at an expected 95% for pupils and it is fantastic to see that we currently have 96% attendance as a school. However, there are a number of pupils whose attendance does fall below this expected standard and parents will be notified should this be the case.

We often experience an increased number of requests for holidays during term time, particularly during the summer months. Please note that unfortunately most of these will be classed as unauthorised unless there are exceptional circumstances surrounding the absence. In this instance, we have a duty to report the absence to the local authority who may choose to issue a fixed penalty notice.

We understand that there will be times when absence is unavoidable and acceptable. Each absence is classed as authorised or unauthorised. Absences are coded as authorised where reasons are considered valid and unauthorised where no explanation or unacceptable reasons are given. Attendance is monitored every half term in school with specific scrutiny of number of days missed as well as patterns to absences - e.g every Monday/Friday or children within the same family being absent at the same time. Whilst we appreciate these circumstances could be entirely legitimate they are often flagged.

The following reasons are for example not acceptable:

- shopping visits
- hair cuts
- care for family members
- days out
- holidays taken in term time (including long weekends taken on Fridays and / or Mondays)
- parental illness
- sleeping in / missing school transport
- birthdays or birthday treats

Every term I carry out a check of attendance across the school and should your child's absence fall below the expected 95% you may receive a letter outlining the expectations we have around attendance. Should this continue to show no improvement you will then be invited to an attendance meeting in school. We do appreciate that children get poorly and need to take time off school. However, I am sure you all support that term time absence has an undoubted negative impact on a child's learning and through the remaining part of the school year we would ask that any absences are kept to a minimum.

What the law says about school attendance: The law requires all children between the ages of 5 and 16 to be in full time education. Under Section 7 of the Education Act 1996 it is the duty of the parent/carer of a child of compulsory school age to ensure that they attend school regularly.

<u>Supervision Order Children's Act 1989:</u> The local authority can apply to the courts where attendance remains poor. A named education supervisor would be appointed to work with the family for up to 12 months to ensure the young person receives full time education.

School Attendance Order Education Act 1996: If this is issued; parents would be directed to register their child at a school named by the local authority. A warning letter can be issued when a pupil has had 10 or more unauthorised absences from school. The warning letter gives parents a period of 15 days of monitoring. If at the end of this period if there has not been an improvement or an improvement has been

made but not sustained, a Penalty Notice will be issued.

Families who take their children out of school for holiday within term time, or for other

unauthorised absences exceeding 10 sessions (5 days). A Penalty Notice will be issued.

Penalty Notice: Each parent/carer would have to pay £60.00 per child. If this is not paid within 21 days, the payment increases to £120.00 per child per parent. Payments will not be accepted after 28 days. If parents do not pay, the Local Authority will prosecute in the Magistrates' Court. If convicted the parent will have a criminal record and may receive a fine of up to £1000. The department for Education have a range of information available regarding attendance.




