Dear Parents and carers

We have had an exciting few weeks to start the summer term.

As the swimming pool left our site we welcomed '10 potential new starters' to Bunbury school. Kitted out with an incubator and brooding box Bunbury school has nurtured and nursed 10 eggs and we were delighted to welcome 9 chicks into school on Wednesday. We were even able to watch a couple of the chicks hatching which was a very special experience.

It has been such a fantastic experience for the children and they have been very keen to visit our new additions as much as possible during the week. Today the chicks were able to visit each classroom before returning to their box for a rest. Each class are currently voting on a name for their class chick.









As we enter the month of May the official statutory testing timetable begins in primary schools across the country. Over the next few weeks and months children in Year 1, Year 2, Year 4 and Year 6 in Bunbury and across the country will take part in some form of statutory testing as listed below.

- Year 1 Phonics Screening test
- Year 2 End of Key Stage 1 tests in reading, writing and maths
- Year 4 Multiplication tests
- Year 6 End of Key Stage 2 tests in reading, writing and maths

Whilst we may all have very different views on the place of testing within the primary curriculum, at Bunbury Primary we keep the testing process very much in perspective for the children. Their mental health and well being is kept firmly at the centre of all our teaching.

For some, it may be quite challenging, emotionally some may be on a rollercoaster and for others they may take it all in their stride. As their headteacher, and a parent, I know that it is not easy being tested as a child at any age but there is something that as teachers we ask the children of Bunbury school to remember. None of the tests listed above measure what makes them special and unique. They do not know that they sing, dance and are extremely creative. They do not measure how kind they are to their friends or how they look after your classmates. They do not know how far they can run, how well they can ride a horse or how many goals they have scored. They do not know that they have overcome hurdles and obstacles in their life and they certainly do not test how special, unique and amazing they are as individuals.



The results from these tests will tell us something, but not everything.

At the end of this week of testing for Year 6 week we held our traditional Bunbury end of SATs celebration. The children enjoyed a games afternoon with their classmates as well as the tradition annual water fight with Rev Tim, Miss Hickson, Mrs Walker and myself. Needless to say I think the adults were soaked from the start!

Parking

Parking continues to be a concern around school. I have noted on several occasions this week cars parked opposite the school entrance and zig zag lines. Whilst this is not illegal it is inconsiderate parking and does cause a real hazard at the start and end of the school day for children crossing the road. Unfortunately, it does appear to be a number of grandparents who are parking here and they do not receive my regular text messages reminding about considerate and safe parking. Please can I ask that if grandparents are collecting/dropping off children at school that they are asked to park considerately and safely.

Final plans are being putting in place for Bunbury Village Day which is due to take place on Saturday 17 June. Now in its 54th year this much-loved annual event is planning to boldly go where no man (or woman) has gone before.... SPACE!

Our one-day mission is to explore strange new worlds, to seek out new life and new civilizations and to that end we have invited a brilliant array of groups to help us along the way.

The <u>Wonderdome</u> Planetarium, an impressively large silver dome, will immerse visitors in a wonderful experience of our universe, using specialised visual and audio equipment, giving a 360-degree view of planets, moons and stars.

The team from Xplore! Science Discovery Centre will be joining us to host a Space Busking session, including the chance to try on real astronauts' suits and moon boots.

We are delighted that Dr Jacco van Loon, the Director of Keele Observatory, part of Keele University, will be on hand to talk to us about his role as a professional astronomer, what are the big questions and why when we look out into space, we learn more about ourselves, not to mention the opportunity to use one of the Observatory's impressive solar telescopes.

This greatly anticipated day will also include the much-admired Chester Brass Band, Bunbury's new Rose Queen and attendants, arena displays and activities, a fun fair, puppet show, donkeys, climbing wall, a myriad of stalls, the traditional WI café, a well-stocked bar, a mouth-watering BBQ the list goes on!

To bring the day to a great end, we will dance the night away courtesy of Green Bullet, who blew the roof off their tent last year, with their high energy mix of rock, punk and indie covers and the very welcome return of Bunbury based The Easy Peelers playing everything from chart hits to The Beatles, 90s indie to Motown.
