Swearing

We are dealing with an uptick of inappropriate language choices and gestures in school at present. The staff team are working incredibly hard to stamp this out in school as it is wholly inappropriate in a primary school setting. Obviously this language is NOT modelled by staff in school nor is it in any aspect of our taught curriculum. I appreciate that children do hear these words out of school in a range of contexts: siblings, social media and internet and within some families. Whilst I am not in a position to enforce what words your child/children are hearing and using at home please can I ask that they are taught the inappropriateness of these word choices

and actions in school. Any instances of swearing or hand gestures will be reported to parents so that we can work together to enforce more appropriate language choices.

Gentle reminders....

Bunbury primary is a healthy eating school. We are noticing a number of unhealthy snacks appearing at breaktime. Please wear possible can we avoid items such as crisps, chocolate bars, cakes, sweets etc during this time. Suitable healthy snacks could include items such as popcorn, fruit, dark chocolate, cucumber, carrot sticks etc

Please can we also ask that parents do not enter the school building from the playground at the back of the school when dropping off children in the morning. For safeguarding and health and safety reasons **ALL** parents/adults do need to sign in at the front of the building.

Parking

Parking continues to be a concern around school. I have noted on several occasions this week cars parked opposite the school entrance and zig zag lines. Whilst this is not illegal it is inconsiderate parking and does cause a real hazard at the start and end of the school day for children crossing the road. Unfortunately, it does appear to be a number of grandparents who are parking here and they do not receive my regular text messages reminding about considerate and safe parking. Please can I ask that if grandparents are collecting/dropping off children at school that they are asked to park considerately and safely.



A number of parents have now approached me regarding setting up a parking committee. We will be meeting after half term to look at ways we can help to make our roads safer for children at those busy times of the school day.

Our one-day mission is to explore strange new worlds, to seek out new life and new civilizations and to that end we have invited a brilliant array of groups to help us along the way.

The Wonderdome Planetarium, an impressively large silver dome, will immerse visitors in a wonderful experience of our universe, using specialised visual and audio equipment, giving a 360degree view of planets, moons and stars.

The team from Xplore! Science Discovery Centre will be joining us to host a Space Busking session, including the chance to try on real astronauts' suits and moon boots.

We are delighted that Dr Jacco van Loon, the Director of Keele Observatory, part of Keele University, will be on hand to talk to us about his role as a professional astronomer, what are the big questions and why when we look out into space, we learn more about ourselves, not to mention the opportunity to use one of the Observatory's impressive solar telescopes.

This greatly anticipated day will also include the much-admired Chester Brass Band, Bunbury's new Rose Queen and attendants, arena displays and activities, a fun fair, puppet show, donkeys, climbing wall, a myriad of stalls, the traditional WI café, a well-stocked bar, a mouth-watering BBQ the list goes on!

To bring the day to a great end, we will dance the night away courtesy of Green Bullet, who blew the roof off their tent last year, with their high energy mix of rock, punk and indie covers and the very welcome return of Bunbury based The Easy Peelers playing everything from chart hits to The Beatles, 90s indie to Motown.
