They have all settled well into their new classes and there has been a buzz of excitement around their new books and learning themes which have been introduced as part of our Pathways to Write approach.

This week we had our first parents evenings of the school year. Thank you as always for your positive feedback about teaching and learning at Bunbury and also the positive partnerships we foster and encourage as part of your child's learning journey with us. Working together we can ensure that our children get the best possible start to their educational journey.

Our head and deputy boys and girls also took on their first major role of the year - welcoming you to school and organising books and parents so that everything ran smoothly. They did an incredible job and we are all very proud of how they conducted themselves on the evening.



As always this week has been packed with further enriching opportunities for our children to enhance the curriculum. This week we have seen Year 3 working within the community planting

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bulbs which has linked into their science work on plants. On Wednesday our Year 1 class also went on an autumnal treasure hunt around the village as part of their curriculum work. I am always extremely grateful to our staff team who organise such fantastic visits to ensure learning takes place both in and outside the classroom.



Respect for all

Today we have taken part in **Show racism the red card** day by wearing red to school. This has been organised by our Rights Respecting School Steering Committee. Show racism the red card are

the UK's leading educational anti-racism charity providing many resources to support us in promoting anti-racism among the young people

within our school. As a school, respect, is central to the personal development of the children who attend our school along with being safe and kind. Respecting those within our class, respecting the adults who work with us and respecting the community in which we live. As a school we model

respectful behaviour in all our interactions between staff and pupils, staff and staff and parents and staff. We thank all parents who support us in

this mutual respectful partnership.



Following the recent parent council meeting one of the points raised was around the teaching of subjects in school. As a school we have a dedicated, committed and highly skilled staff team who receive regular





CPD to ensure practice is as up to date as possible. Having been in the profession for over 2 decades there have been many changes to the curriculum but also to the pedagogy around delivery.

We appreciate that we are immersed in this daily and the changes to teaching practice are very familiar to us. To support parents understanding and hopefully answer any questions or concerns around pedagogy we will be putting together some curriculum sections in our newsletter over the forth coming weeks.

Our first curriculum input this week will explain the teaching of **reading** at school.

Read Write Inc (RWINC) is used to facilitate the teaching of reading within reception, Year 1 and into Year 2. The following presentation which is available on our website clearly explains how this is scafolded and developed through these crucial years.

Once children have completed the Read Write Inc scheme, reading is taught using 'Pathways to Read'. This is a systematic approach to the teaching of the reading skills outlined in the National Curriculum using a range of engaging texts. It consists of a whole class/group lesson, followed by a small grouped reading session which provides children with the opportunity to master a key reading skill and finally a follow-on task which allows them to evidence the skills they have mastered independently. During these reading sessions, pupils will read aloud to their peers

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and/or the teacher. The focus, however, is not solely on reading aloud but on teaching retrieval and inference skills to build comprehension. For example, the teacher may be showing the children where to find the words in the text which describe the actions of a character and then explaining to them that through these actions, we can infer that the character is feeling a particular way, even if the text does not explicitly tell us this.

This is supported through reading at home as part of our partnership with parents through regular 1:1 times throughout the week to develop fluency.



We are always delighted to hear about how children 'Let their Light Shine' in school but also out of school as well. We have so many gifted and talented children both academically but also in other areas - all of which are equally valued and celebrated. This week I was extremely proud to hear about Rose and her achievements in gymnastics. Well done Rose
