As you will be aware, we invited all parents and carers of children attending Bunbury Primary School to complete our latest parent survey via School Spider regarding the school's current provision. As a school, we are never complacent and are always looking at ways we can make our provision for the children the very best it can be. As head teacher, I welcome all comments both positive and negative and always look to act on those I feel will benefit **all** the children of Bunbury.

In total 36 / 124 families completed the survey which is about 30% of the school.

Where parents/carers felt that the school needed to develop:

'A more varied range of extra-curricular clubs.'

Clubs run by the school staff are all done on a voluntarily basis and often pull on their interests and specialities: gardening, netball, reading etc. As staff are volunteering to lead these sessions at the end of the school day, I would not ask them to take on an extra-curricular club in an area out of their comfort zone. Many of the other clubs we have in school rely on what opportunities there are locally that we can encourage to come into school. We are always seeking to bring new, varied and different experiences into school but rely heavily on the local market and businesses as to what is available. We will as always continue to try and recruit different companies to lead varying extra-curricular activities.

'The school could participate in local hockey events'

When invited the school will continue to try and participate in local sporting events, including hockey. We competed in an event after an invite on Thursday 24th March and won the hockey tournament against 6 other teams.



'I would like diversity to be challenged a little more and see how the school are teaching acceptance and diversity in race, gender and identity.'

Diversity and acceptance are a very important part of our PSHE (personal, emotional and health education) curriculum. Our PSHE curriculum which incorporates our RSE (relationship and sex education) has been designed especially for Bunbury Aldersey School. Through the school year, the children explore 3 areas: The Right to be Me which looks at diversity, acceptance, tolerance, identity and respect. The Right to Learn and The Right to be Safe and Healthy which looks at relationship education as well as climate change and online safety. 'The range of subjects is the same as all state schools.'

Bunbury school have maintained the teaching of a very broad and balanced curriculum through their development of the Connected curriculum approach where all children are encouraged to 'Let their Light Shine'. The curriculum on offer, as praised and recognised in the 2020 Ofsted inspection has not been narrowed to focus only on reading, writing and maths. As a school, we feel that this would be limiting for a number of our pupils. In addition to the range of subjects in Bunbury school, we also offer Forest schools teaching as well as personal development with our curriculum enhancements. Our Unicef Rights Respecting Silver status, Mentally Healthy schools work and our PSHE curriculum ensure that during pupil's time at Bunbury they develop into academically and emotionally well rounded young people.

'Whilst we see a curriculum overview for the term we don't get a great detail of what they are learning'
