


For children in reception we will be having a more detailed meeting on Thursday 29th September at 4pm.

Sensory Toys and Sensory chews

At Bunbury school we take pride in the inclusive environment we have created. We are aware that for some children with sensory needs the classroom can be a difficult place. For some the use of ear defenders can help the classroom to feel a more comfortable place and for others the addition of a sensory toy or a sensory chew can help reduce anxiety.

These additions to the classroom are necessary for these children to ensure that they are not over anxious in classroom situations and are for clinical needs. We are though now seeing a number of children bringing these items in, having several of them on their table with some making a noise which can be distracting for others.

Please can I ask that children only bring these items in on agreement with either myself, SEND lead or class teacher and that they are only used by the child they are intended for and not shared around between friends. These items are not toys.



Bunbury Primary School Sporting News Autumn term 2022



At Bunbury, we are blessed to have so many sporting opportunities for children from our reception class right through to Year 6. Under the instruction of our sports partnership at Tarporley High School, we participate in various sporting competitions throughout the academic year from dodgeball to gymnastics to name but a few. These events are all organised by the High school and as a school we are extremely thankful to the time they invest in organising these events for their primary partners.

We always take considerable time when making team selections to ensure that firstly, those who may wish to take part maybe offered the chance and secondly, to ensure that children are chosen in order to develop their skills, abilities and self- confidence. It is though not always possible each time to take all children who volunteer as numbers are often restricted.

Our teams and squad selections are done on a rotational basis with a core of children chosen who excel in a particular sport in order to hone their abilities within a competitive environment alongside those children who show enthusiasm and want to have a go at taking part in a collaborative team sport.

Some may believe that we should be going into a competition to win with the strongest team. However we all know that part of becoming a good well rounded sports person is learning that you may not win each time and to work as a team.

Both myself and Mr Friel agree that our team selection will never become elitist as this does not sit with our school vision of 'Let your light shine.' We will always ensure that there is an equal mix of those who excel and those who show enthusiasm and a desire to try something new within a competitive environment.

Car Parking and Speeding

As we have all returned back to school I am very mindful of the parking situation once more outside school. Please can I encourage, where possible, all children to either walk or cycle to school and that this message is shared within your families for all those responsible for dropping off or collecting children from school.

Where children need to be travelling by car please can I ask that you park considerately around the surrounding area for example by:

- not blocking residents driveways
- not parking on the pavement
- not parking on corners of roads
- not parking in areas where it makes it difficult for children to cross or forces them to walk on the road.
- not parking opposite the school entrance or zig zag lines
- not parking in the minibus zone unless displaying a disability badge

Unfortunately we have already had examples of inconsiderate parking this week and as I have done previously I will be sharing examples of this on our newsletter.

Cones have now been placed opposite the school to ensure that this area is kept free of cars.

It has also been highlighted to me from concerned local residents that some cars are travelling at excess speeds through the village during these times. I am unsure whether these are parent cars or local cars. I would ask however that anyone travelling through the village at drop off or collection times is mindful of their speed and extra vigilant when driving around school exit, parked cars and adjacent roads where children could be crossing.

Parent What's App Groups

As a school we are aware that there are Parent What's App groups for each school year. As a working parent myself I thoroughly understand and appreciate that these can be vital sources of information regarding things like trip reminders, own clothes days, PE days etc. However, these groups can also cause unnecessary concern and anxiety from comments which are made. From tiny sparks, towering infernos can grow and for the second time this year I have needed to spend valuable leadership time responding to the effects of a thread. Whilst I have absolutely no control over what parents post on social media sites or comments they make I would like to ask that these sites are used for the purpose they have been set up: to inform.

If parents do have any worries or concerns my door is always open for discussion. I am always thankful to those parents who liaise with the school and talk through their concerns and questions which I can then answer rather than speculating and surmising on the Whats App group.
