I can't believe another week has gone by in school and we are rapidly approaching the end of the spring term already.

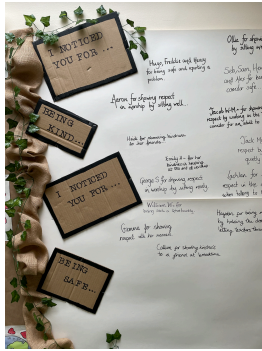
This week we have enjoyed the unexpected Spring snow and children participated in some communal snow man building during their break times on the school field.



We are now at the end of our second week of officially implementing our new behaviour policy in school which is based on the promotion of positive, respectful relationships. The focus of our policy is around the 3 key words of:



Children are praised and celebrated for demonstrating those behaviours around school both inside and outside. It has been fantastic to highlight those children around the classrooms and corridors with our recognition “noticeboards” rather than the negative approach of moving pegs publicly when a mistake had been made. Pupil voice clearly shows that the new approach has



been positively received and those who demonstrate safe, kind and respectful behaviours are proud to be recognised and celebrated.

Of course children do make mistakes and as well as a consequence there is always an opportunity to learn from this mistake through a discussion. Depending on the severity of the incident there are different levels which are followed and these are clearly listed within the new procedure. I appreciate that we all have our own personal views of how children should be disciplined based on our own experiences as children, our experiences and beliefs as parents and circumstances we may have encountered during life.

At Bunbury primary school our new procedure is based on what is right for **all** our children and staff to ensure that **all** are given the opportunity to flourish, grow and develop.

Year 2 enjoyed an art workshop creating Tudor Roses which was led by Mrs Waddington one of our Local governing committee members. A huge thank you to her for donating her time and talents to support the children with their artwork. The artwork is now complete and I am sure you will agree it is a delight to see.



I am always incredibly proud of our pupils when they use their own initiative to raise money for a cause of charity they feel passionately about. Jack and Harry have now joined our list of fantastic fundraisers in school. Over half term Harry and Jack did a little project to make and sell keyrings to raise money for those affected by the Turkish/Syrian earthquake. They worked really hard and have raised nearly £100 so far. What a fantastic effort boys- we are all really proud of you.

We have had a number of people parking recently in our dedicated school bus parking space. Please can this be used by the bus only so that we can ensure the children can be dropped off and safely collected from school. I am also mindful that some children are collected by Grandparents so ask that this message is shared with all who collect children from school.



Smart watches

We are seeing a number of children in school wearing smart watches. Whilst I am sure these are fantastic items to own for the children we ask that they are **not worn to school**. A number of these items do come with the function of being able to take pictures and this is happening in classrooms. Whilst we

have not had an incident yet I do not want to be in a position where a photo taken during the school day of a pupil or teacher has been circulated on the web. Particularly as we have some children in school whose parents do not wish their child's image to be shared in this way. Whilst I appreciate this maybe disappointing for the children I am sure you will agree that there is a potential safeguarding risk involved with such items

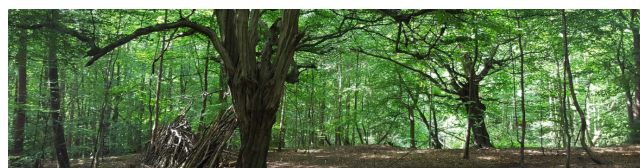


Cheshire Forest School
